- Write several referee reports on articles that have been submitted to journals.
- Read the papers by the seven labor economists who are presenting in the Monday seminar series and prepare a one page referee report—We will discuss these papers on the Thursday before the papers are presented.

<u>Grades</u>—Grades will be based on the work described above and on several short problem sets covering the core material. Since you will all be tested on the material in the labor comprehensive exam, there will be no final.
