## Course Description and Requirements

The purpose of this course is to provide a selected survey of the field of labor economics. Topics include human capital, estimating the returns to education, discrimination, and unions, to name a few. The course will focus on empirical work designed to test microeconomic theories of labor markets.

The course has four main goals: to introduce some of the current issues in labor economics, to increase familiarity with the common econometric techniques used in labor economics, to increase knowledge of the data sources, and to help students start thinking about research topics in labor economics. To that end, there are five requirements: a paper, a final exam, two class presentations, and occasional assignments.

I will discuss more about the paper during the first weeks of class. The final exam will take place at the end of the term. During the first two weeks, students will sign up for a paper to present in class. The second presentation will be the student's own paper and will be at the end of the semester. The course assignments will consist of some simple empirical tasks, and a referee report.
